
The History of Camping



The investigative documentary accompanies perpetrators and victim on their quest for forgiveness.





Gotthard -Mountain Pass of Pioneers



The Gotthard is one of the most important Alpine passes in Europe today. Traders and pilgrims once crossed the pass by foot in about 30 hours from Flüelen, Switzerland, to Bellinzona, Italy. In the 19th century, the carriages of the Gotthard Post connected people in the north and south for the first time by transporting daily mail. Today, global warming poses major problems for the people living close to the Gotthard. Using a variety of methods, specialists are trying to mitigate its effects and better predict the longterm consequences. We journey through the exciting history of the pass - from the small route through the high mountains to the longest railway tunnel in the world.









Kalanag - Hitler's Magician

Helmut Schreiber alias Kalanag is one of the most controversial entertainers - a man with a white waistcoat and a dark past. As the "court magician of the Nazis", Helmut Schreiber enchanted parties for Goebbels and entertained the masses at NSDAP events. At the same time, he was responsible for propaganda films. After the war, he was no longer allowed to work in the film industry. So he turned his hobby into a profession and started

an international career as the world's greatest post-war magician neglecting his past. Helmut Schreiber's unbelievable career is a perfect example of unlimited merciless complicity and the suppression of the Nazi past after 1945. The film tells the extraordinary story of Kalanag, for whom deception, disguise and trickery were his life's principles.

The Nazi Whaling Squadron

At least 15,000 blue and fin whales were slaughtered by the German whaling squadron between 1936 and 1939. An intervention in nature from which the whale population has never fully recovered. More than 80 years ago, the German whaling fleet was the third largest in the world. The Nazi regime wanted to close the so-called "fat gap" to solve the country's problem of fat supply. The admonishing and poignant voices of the last surviving eyewitnesses reconstruct how the largest animals on earth were almost eradicated so Germany could go to war.







Berlin - Fateful Years of a Metropolis

A Berlin chronicle of superlatives: six decades, from the 1950s to the 2000s, when Berlin is once again the capital of a united Germany. By using archival footage from both sides, news and interviews by former channel Freies Berlin, and material from GDR television, the series vividly displays everyday life in Berlin from both sides of the wall. The divided city shows a diverse picture: cosmopolitan city and quiet suburbs, international politics and everyday life, the scene for stories big and small.
